Atelier Frankfurt, the largest art center in Hesse, is shaped by rotating exhibitions, projects and events that give insight into artists' work processes and facilitate dialogue within the local as well as international art scene. The 11,000 m<sup>2</sup> former warehouse allows the nonprofit association to provide ateliers for more than 200 artists and creative workers. Fine art, artist talks, discussions and theories are just as important to the facility as culinary arts, music, dance and literature.

### PORTIKUS

**Contemporary art in a new old building on the Main River**

The Portikus exhibition space takes its name from Frankfurt's old city library, which was largely destroyed in World War II and later, from 1987 to 2003, became well-known as an exhibition hall for contemporary art. In 2003, the location was tapped as the home for the new Literaturhaus center. Christoph Mäckler won the subsequent architectural competition to design the new Portikus, with his design for an external reconstruction of the old city library. The current building is an essential part of the University of Fine Arts Hamburg (HFBK) – Städelsschule. As such, it is used for exhibiting, publicizing and discussing rising young artists as well as established artists and their works.

### SAASFEE\* PAVILLON

**Collectively different**

saasfee\*pavillon is an art and exhibition center for the saasfee\* artists' collective. It sees itself as a platform for art, media, design and music, with a special focus on interdisciplinary projects. As Frankfurt's only collectively run art space, it forms an interface between the established art business and the off-scene, and it initiates exhibition projects that give rising young artists a chance to show their work. The exhibition space's style and aesthetics speak for themselves – the floor-to-ceiling windows offer a view into a sunken garden and the surrounding nature.

### SCHIRN KUNSTHALLE

#### The present day writ large

For 30 years now, Schirn has offered high-quality programming for the entire family, constantly featuring new perspectives on art and society. More than 250 exhibitions have been held here to date, and works by artists like Wassily Kandinsky, Frida Kahlo and Henri Matisse have been shown in large solo exhibitions. The focus is on topics from art history and cultural history, as well as discourses and trends from the present day — diverse, international and progressive. The Mini-Schirn area is a special offering: while parents view the exhibits, their offspring can explore the fanciful children's area.

### STALBURG THEATER

#### A treasure with its own productions

Stalburg Theater, founded by Michael Herl in 1998, is located in a historic 15th-century building. This treasure of the local cultural scene mainly presents comedy shows, theater and sometimes musical events. What is especially important for the team are their own productions, which now make up nearly 80 percent of the program, with more to come. The theater also includes a restaurant area with bistro tables, a bar and a small selection of dishes.

On the Sachsenhäuser side of the Main River, the Museumsufer (“Museum Riverbank”) offers numerous museum-going options. The German Film Museum, Museum Angewandte Kunst (museum of applied arts), the Ethnological Museum, the world-famous Städel art museum, the Museum for Communication and many more invite visitors to discover culture all along the Schaumainkai embankment. Held once a year in late August, the Museumsufer Festival has become one of Frankfurt’s most important events. Incidentally, the museum park and Main embankment are wonderful spots for a relaxing post-museum break.

The Künstlerhaus ("Artists' House") is one of Germany's oldest and most important production spaces and venues for free, experimental and innovative theater. With national and international guest appearances, the focus is on the areas of theater and dance, performance and music. Avant-garde is the standard here. For instance, in recent years it has put on various productions by Milo Rau, who is considered one of Europe's most controversial and also exciting directors. In the wake of the coronavirus crisis, Mousonturm developed an innovative concept, using loges to redesign its facilities in a hive-like, pandemic-appropriate way.

The project is the brainchild of James and David Ardinast, who are constantly enriching Frankfurt's gastronomic map. Located in the 25Hours Hotel, the rooftop terrace turns into a chill lounge in the summer months, offering food, drinks and music.

Claudia Nauth and Matthias Krämer consumed products and shopped like most people until late 2017. But at some point they couldn't live with the quantity of "normal" plastic waste and started thinking differently, reorganizing their lives and changing their shopping routines. Then came the business idea. Now there are two shops, one at the Dom (Cathedral) and one at Lokalbahnhof (the local train station), where you can "ulf" (as the store calls its unpackaged shopping) to your heart's content. You can buy organic food, care products, cleaning products, household items and practical things for when you're on the go.

Vegan, vegetarian, sustainable – fresh soups, quiches, crisp salads, cakes and other daily specials can all be found at Suppengrün on Berger Straße. There's a special twist, which at the same time contributes to more conscious, sustainable food handling: Suppengrün also uses fruit and vegetables that might not look so nice anymore – they can no longer be sold in the adjacent produce store owned by the restaurant, but they are still quite good to eat. That keeps food waste to an absolute minimum, and guests can enjoy a constantly changing menu of healthy dishes – it's simply a pleasure!

### HAFENPARK

#### A meeting place for sports fans

Frankfurt gained a wonderful new outdoor recreational attraction when Hafenpark opened in 2015. The four-hectare sports and recreational facility in the Ostend district is near the Main embankment and is very popular especially in the summer months. Skaters, bikers and other sports enthusiasts of all ages meet here to show off their skills. The park offers free fields and courts for soccer, volleyball, basketball and even badminton games, along with two fitness circuits with varying levels of difficulty.

### PALMENGARTEN

#### Floral worlds

Frankfurt's Palmengarten is colorful and unique. The 22-hectare park grounds, with a large number of lovingly maintained greenhouses, showcase vegetation from various climate zones. ### MAINUFER

#### The heart of the city

Both on the city side and the Sachsenhäuser side, Frankfurt's residents use the Main River promenades as a local urban recreation area and central meeting spot, an inviting place for a long stroll along the riverbank. From visiting the Nizza Garden to crossing the Eiserner Steg (iron footbridge) or taking a break on a bench to soak up the sun, visitors to the Main embankment will find plenty of variety. People who are hungry after all that relaxation can drop by the Maincafé for a snack.

### BETHMANN PARK / CHINESE GARDEN

#### Like a phoenix from the ashes

In the early hours of June 1, 2017, the fire department was called to put out a major fire in the Chinese Garden. Unknown persons had set fire to the "Wasserpavillon des geläuterten Herzens" (water pavilion of purified souls). The garden was closed for more than two years for extensive renovations. Craftsmen came all the way from China to create a faithful reconstruction of the pavilion, using Chinese building materials and traditional techniques. The reopening was finally celebrated in October 2019, and it is once again a wonderful place to relax and unwind.

## RECREATION

### GOETHETURM

#### The symbol of Frankfurt

In 2017, Frankfurt's famous lookout tower also fell victim to arson. There was great outrage – and it quickly became clear that most of the city's residents as well as political decision-makers wanted a faithful reconstruction of the original tower. Rebuilding work started in late 2019, and in July 2020 the new tower was complete. Three months later, a reopening ceremony was held for the 43-meter-tall structure. The popular excursion site is surrounded by a waterslide, a garden restaurant and a labyrinth, and in December there is also a small Christmas market that is very popular among Frankfurt's citizens.

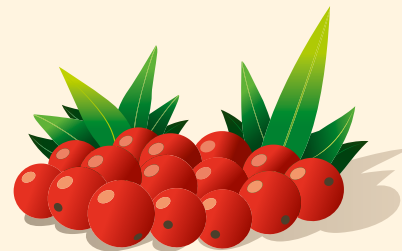
#### A new hangout in Sachsenhausen

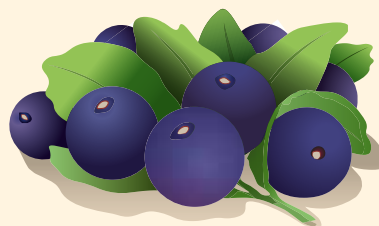

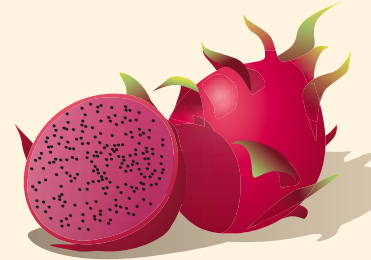

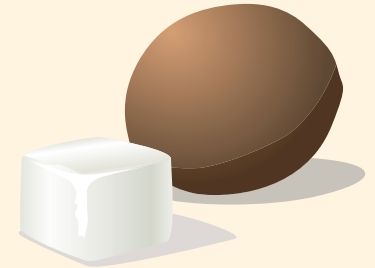
